



9] VILLAGE HALL INCLUDING APPOINTMENTS

The chairman said that the resignation of Carol Thurman as booking officer had been received, the reason being she was leaving the village. Her job was being advertised and the chairman appealed for helping in trying to find a successor.

The council were informed by the chairman he had managed to reduce the amount of money required by The Crown in the proposed new lease for the hall. The original request for £750 per annum had been reduced to £200 and the new lease would be received in due course.

The condition of the toilet block was discussed with general agreement there was need for a total refurbishment of the area. Steps were to be taken to obtain quotations for the proposed work once a specification had been drawn up.

The chairman reported he had been called out on an occasion when the toilets in the hall were blocked and after considerable effort he had been able to clear the problem.
