1] APOLOGIES Coun. Kevin Brooks

2] DECLARATIONS OF INTERESTS There were none

3] MINUTES FROM THE PREVIOUS MEETING HELD ON JANUARY 25, 2017 were accepted as presented and signed by the chairman

4] CLERK'S REPORT
There was nothing to report

5] PUBLIC SESSION LIMITED
Litter on Stoke Lane and Manor Lane was a continuing problem. Rushcliffe's Streetwise scheme were thanked for quick response to the latest tipping incident on Manor Lane. It was agreed to invite Mr David Banks from the Borough council to the parish meeting to discuss the continuing increase in litter dumping.

6] CORRESPONDENCE
Notts CPRE advised of the 2017 Best Kept Village competition and after discussion it was agreed the village should enter. A leaflet would be produced for door to door delivery urging residents to support the efforts needed to ensure the village was neat and tidy. The first round of judging would be in June.
Rushcliffe Borough Council confirmed a 100 per cent rate rebate on the village hall for 2017-18. The rebated figure was £780 55p.

7] PLAYING FIELD
Some work was being done to clear moss from the play area. Everything else was in order although it was agreed attention would be needed later in the year to some of the equipment.

8] VILLAGE HALL
A letter from bookings clerk Lesley Wells was read in which she outlined comments received from some of the regular hirers regarding the general state of the hall. There were difficulties in cleaning between back-to-back hiring's but the caretaker had been asked to keep an eye on things.
The chairman said he was disappointed that the application for funding for the plan to improve the toilets had not been successful. He was now completing the application to the Lottery fund.
It was confirmed that regular use items including toilet and kitchen rolls etc were kept locked in the outside lock-up building.

9] PLANNING

17/00155/VAR P Barlow, Sycamore Farm, Main Road Vary condition 4 of 16.01452/ful to allow for the housing of all agricultural live stock throughout the farming year. Do not object.

Rushcliffe Local Plan / Green Belt Review Two. Members discussed the reports presented by the Borough Council and in particular the effect on Shelford if two proposed sites at Radcliffe, including the one at Lodge Farm for 180 dwellings and which actually falls within Shelford parish, were developed.

Another site to create concerns from a traffic point of view was the possibility of use of land adjacent to the traffic lights at Kirk Hill at East Bridgford where it was suggested 70 new homes could be built. The council were to express their concerns on the effects on Shelford from a traffic point of view and the effect on wildlife, the countryside and the Green corridor between East Bridgford and Newton.

The chairman said an Inspector had been appointed to rule on the proposed gravel extraction scheme for Shelford and would be carrying out the inquiry into the plans from June 27 at County Hall. He and Coun. Beynon would be giving evidence on behalf of the parish council and the action group SAGE. Coun. Mrs Cutts said she would be also taking part in the inquiry.

10] FINANCE: PAYMENT OF CHEQUES was approved as per the circulated list.

11] CHAIRMAN'S MATTERS
Nothing was raised.

The next meeting on May would be the parish meeting and the annual meeting of the parish council.
