Minutes of a meeting of the Parish Council held in the Village Hall, Shelford, on Wednesday November 28, 2018 at 6.30pm

- 1] APOLOGIES There were none
- 2] DECLARATION OF INTERESTS Coun. Bingham on payment of accounts.
- 3] MINUTES FROM THE PREVIOUS MEETING HELD ON SEPTEMBER 26, 2018 were accepted as circulated and signed by the chairman.
- 4] CLERK'S REPORT
WW1 event, the chairman said the event had been success and had involved a good number of local residents. The war memorial now cleaned had been commented on by numerous people. It was agreed there was a need for a further seven lamppost poppies for next year.
Unitary Authority. The clerk said Notts County Council will be carrying out a consultation before any final decision is taken.
Playing field fencing. The chairman said one quote had been received. Another was being sought.
- 5] REPORT FROM THE DISTRICT AND COUNTY COUNCIL MEMBER
Coun. Lawrence said the Borough had been busy in various ways, and were looking closely at the plans by Notts County Council to consider introducing a Unitary Authority. He said neighbouring Newton parish council were looking to progress a scheme for a community centre. He also spoke of hosing schemes at Radcliffe with up to 340 houses being planned for Shelford Road.
- 6] PUBLIC SESSION LIMITED TO 15 MINUTES
A resident said a suggestion that Manor Lane be considered for restricted use similar to Trent Lane a East Bridghford would almost certainly mean an end to the bus service as it is known at present. He said that Notts County Council had agreed to offer funding towards the village service but understood that so far the bus operator had not requested it. The fact that the county had carried out an improvement scheme to the surface of Oatfield Lane was noted.
- 7] CORRESPONDENCE
Yellow Ribbon Re-enactment were to come forward in due course with a date for the suggested even to take place in Shelford next year. The council have agreed to pay £300 towards the event.
Nick Edmunds, Perfect Motion organisation were proposing a road running event in 2019 with Shelford on its route. Residents would be advised of the proposed event which would affect through traffic for a short period.
CPRE wrote seeking support for a deposit return system for bottles etc and the council agreed it would back the scheme.
- 8] PLAYING FIELD
Nothing was raised.
- 9] VILLAGE HALL
Refurbishment work on the committee room was almost complete.
- 10] PLANNING
No applications or decisions from Rushcliffe Borough Council.

11] ENVIRONMENT
Nothing was raised.

12] FINANCIAL --
a] Accounts to pay were approved as per the circulated list
The clerk said he will produce a budget report for the next meeting when a decision must be taken on the precept for 2019-20. It is planned the report will be given to members before Christmas. If members have any item for consideration for next year were to let the clerk know.

13] CASUAL VACANCY
The council had until December 2 to co-opt to fill the vacancy, after that it is too near the next due election on May 2 to permit it.

14] CHAIRMAN'S MATTERS
Two incidents of crime in the village had been reported in the most recent police report. The requested signs for deer crossing on the top road and in respect of horses in the village had bene erected.
